Erasmus Mundus

Scholars

- *Grants for incoming third-country scholars of high academic quality to carry out teaching or research assignments for the Masters Course*
- *Scholar mobility: 13,000 € per scholar (3 months x 4,000 € plus a fixed amount of 1,000 € for travel expenses)*
- *Erasmus Mundus Masters consortia select scholars on the basis of CVs, study and academic merits, motivation, recommendations, language skills, etc.*
- *The European Commission confirms this selection*



Erasmus Mundus External Cooperation Window

Main Objective

Mutual enrichment and better understanding between the European Union and partner countries, through the exchange of persons, knowledge and skills at higher education level.



Erasmus Mundus External Cooperation Window

Funds for Russia in 2007: 5 mio €

Eligible actions:

- *Organisation of mobility*
- *Scholarships: travel, living allowance, full insurance, fees*
 - *Undergraduate; Master; **Doctorate; Post doctorate; Academic staff fellowship***

Minimum Number of Scholarships for Russia in 2007: 175



Erasmus Mundus External Cooperation Window

LEVEL	Duration	Max. Amount (€)
Doctorate (20%)	6-34 months	64,050 <i>(1,500 living allowance per month+3,000 fees per year+75 per month for insurance)</i>
Postdoctorate (10%)	6-10 months	23,750 <i>(1,800 living allowance, etc.)</i>
Academic staff (10%)	1-3 months	7,725 <i>(2,500 living allowance, etc.)</i>

New Guidebook "YOUR SCHOLARSHIP IN EUROPE" (2006)

EU-Russia ties in the area of education have seen a steady expansion over the past couple of years. The Roadmap for the Fourth Common Space on Research, Education and Culture, agreed at the EU-Russia Summit in Moscow in May, 2005, lays out three main areas for cooperation:

- Encouraging closer co-operation in the area of non-formal education;
- Promoting the development of life skills education.
- Making the European Higher Education Area a reality, in accordance with the principles of the Bologna Process (see below).

These objectives are realised through practical measures and projects including facilitating links between Russian and European universities; encouraging awards of joint or double diplomas; establishing quality monitoring systems for Russian curricula and institutions, as well as internal university quality-control systems; supporting Russian participation in the Erasmus Mundus programme; promoting EU studies in Russia (including training for government officials and post-graduate students and the establishment of the European Studies Institute at MGIMO); and promoting the study of Russia and the Russian language in the EU, as well as the study of the EU and European languages in Russia.

The Bologna Process

The aim of the Bologna Process is to establish a Europe-wide framework for higher education that will have a real impact of the lives of European citizens: individuals from participating countries will be able to move freely between higher education institutions, jobs, business sectors and countries. It will make students' learning experience more adaptable to changing labour market demands, and increase the competitiveness of higher education systems in the European Higher Education Area. Russia joined the Bologna process in 2003.

The main principles of the [Bologna Declaration](#), as signed by European Education Ministers on 19 June 1999 in Bologna, are to:

- adopt a coherent system of easily readable and comparable degrees;
- adopt a system with two main cycles (undergraduate/graduate);
- establish a system of credits (such as ECTS);
- overcome obstacles to student/teacher mobility;
- promote European co-operation in quality assurance.

How can I get involved?

There are numerous opportunities for Russian teachers, students and institutions to benefit from the increased EU-Russia cooperation on education. Details of how to participate in current programmes are given below.
