

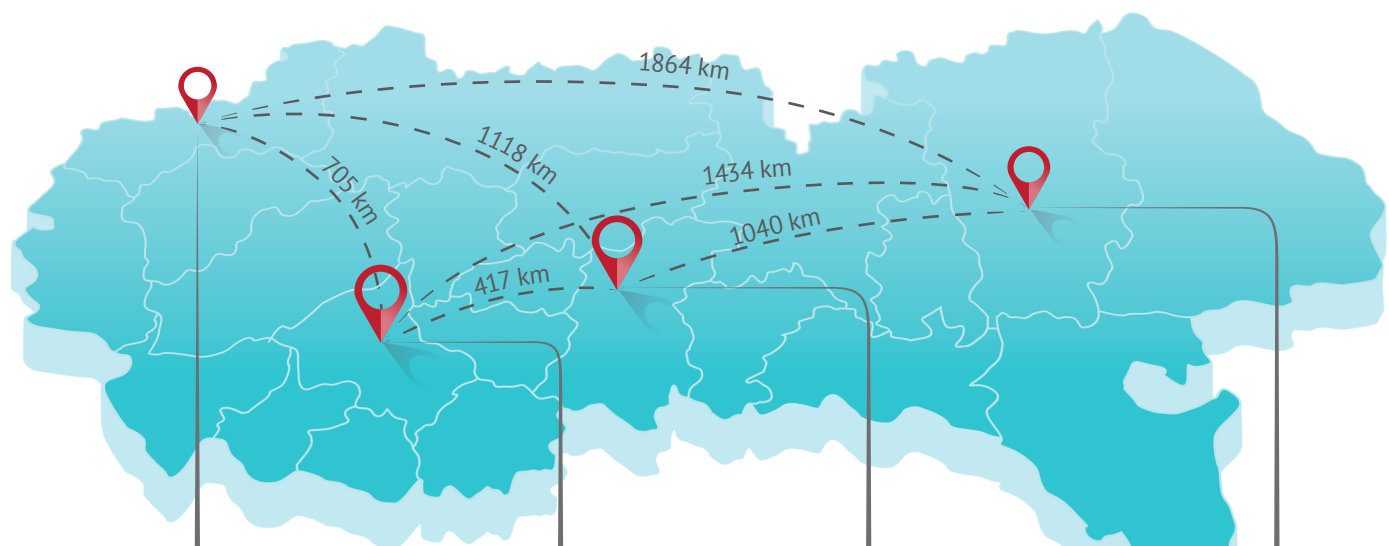

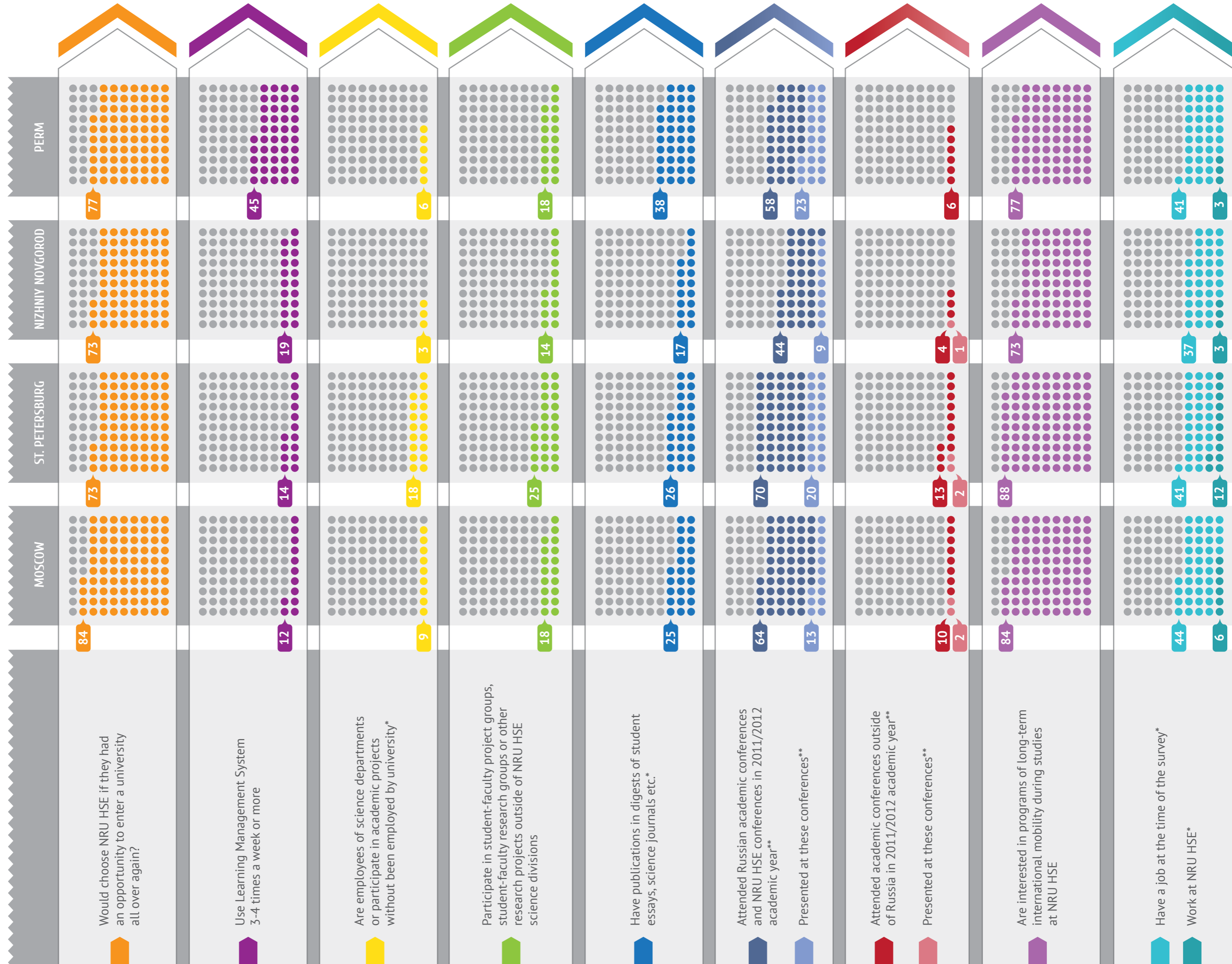

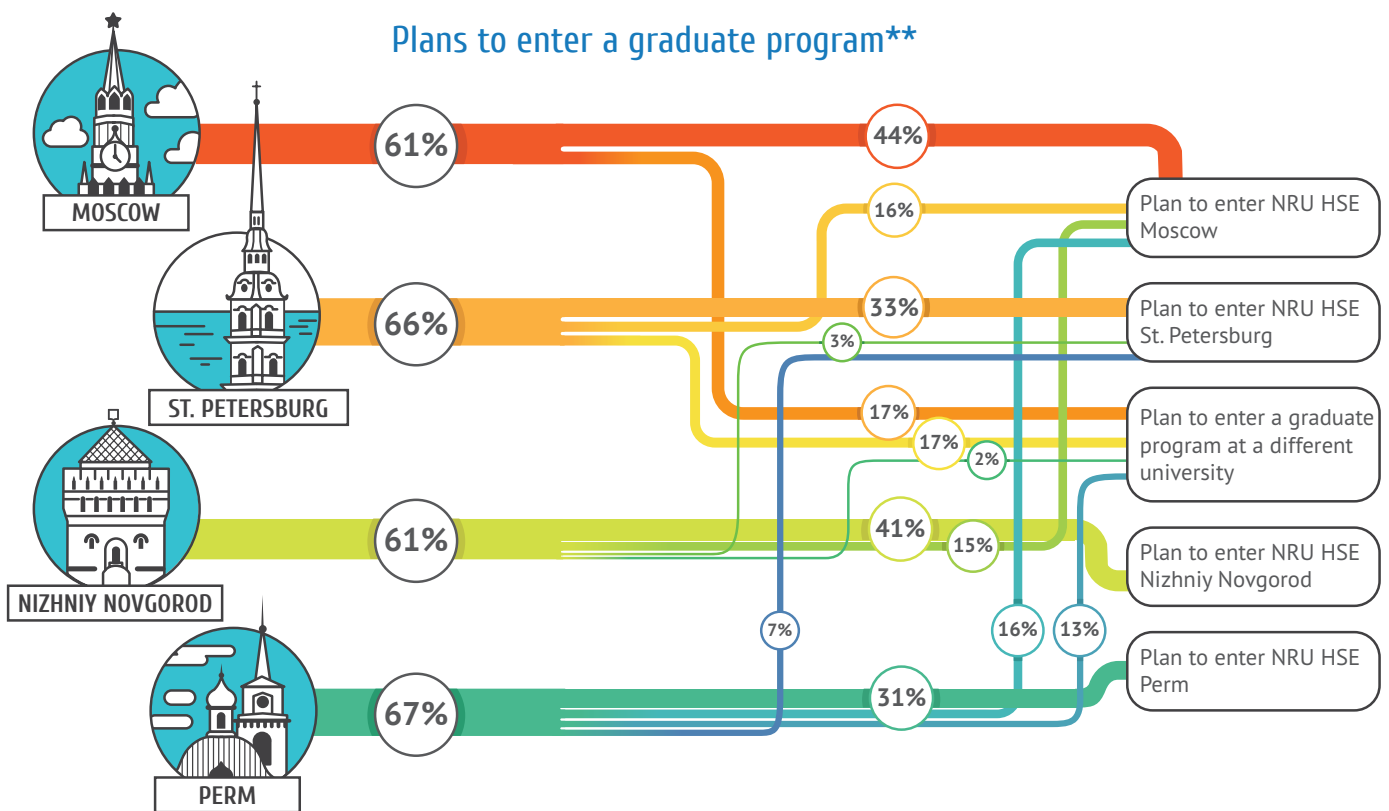
Good job, AI!

Study process is built in a way that HSE is typically grading students. However, during annual Monitoring of Student Life the roles change: now students have an opportunity to grade HSE. Below is data about how students evaluate conditions created by NRU HSE for their academic and extracurricular life, and about students' desire to continue education on their home campus.

Evaluation of conditions created for studying at NRU HSE*

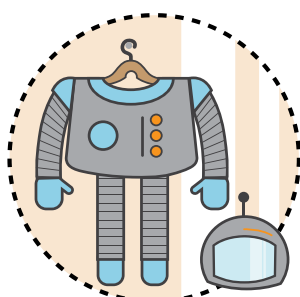

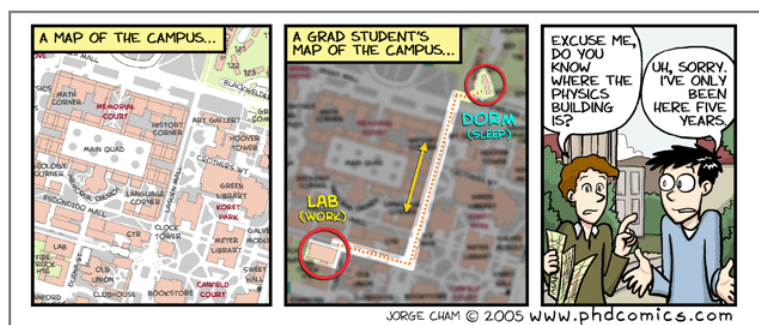
