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# Moscow arrival checklist

## Migration Rules

- You can read about the migration rules of the Russian Federation (refer to [ivisa.hse.ru/en](http://ivisa.hse.ru/en) in the section «For Students: Visa Rules», «For Students: Visa-free Regime»).
- Getting registered at one's place of residence (refer to [ivisa.hse.ru/en](http://ivisa.hse.ru/en) in the section «Arrival to Russia»).
- Set a reminder about the timeframe for extending your student visa and migration registration.
- Undertake the procedures for international students for a medical examination, fingerprinting and official photographing (refer to [ivisa.hse.ru/en](http://ivisa.hse.ru/en) in the section «Obligatory Procedures for International Students»).
- Always carry the originals of your migration documents on you at all times: passport, migration card, registration notification, and fingerprinting confirmation card.

## Onboarding at HSE University

- Take part in the orientation session for international students – there, you will learn about life and studies in Moscow, as well as the myriad of services offered by HSE University (visit the [istudents.hse.ru/en](http://istudents.hse.ru/en) in the section «Obligatory Procedures for International Students»).
- Visit the study office of your degree programme – meet with the staff members of the study office of your programme and learn more about the study processes at HSE University (you can find out more on your degree programme website).
- Take the e-course on security (using the SmartLMS platform).

## Getting Ready for Studies

- Gain access to your corporate e-mail through the SmartLMS system (more information can be provided by your programme's study office).
- Get issued a student ID and HSE pass (more information about these cards and other student documents can be found in the «Student Documents» section at [istudents.hse.ru/en](http://istudents.hse.ru/en)).
- Learn about class timetables (timetables are posted on your programme's website, and you may also request them from your programme manager).

## **Life in Moscow**

- Purchase a SIM card in any mobile shop in Moscow (refer to the «Life in Moscow» section of this Handbook).
- Draw up an application for a Moscow social card at the local My Documents Multifunctional Centre (the timeframes for submission and receipt of cards can be found in the «Student Documents» section at [istudents.hse.ru/en](http://istudents.hse.ru/en)).
- Learn more about transport and getting around Moscow (visit the «Moscow Transport» section at [istudents.hse.ru/en](http://istudents.hse.ru/en)).
- Make sure you have the contact info for your country's embassy or consulate; we also recommend registering with your consulate/embassy (more information can be found in the «Consular Registration» section at [istudents.hse.ru/en](http://istudents.hse.ru/en)).



# Migration rules

## Migration Card

- Necessary for all international students  
(with the exception of citizens of the Republic of Belarus)
- Issued **free of charge** upon every entry to the Russian Federation at official border crossings
- Necessary for legally staying in the Russian Federation.

When your migration card is issued, check that all information is correct, e.g., that the purpose of your visit is «**Education**».

## Visa

- Necessary for all international students for whom a visa is obligatory.
- An initial visa is issued by a consular services or Russian Visa Centre in your main country of residency (single-entry); this visa does not exceed 90 days.
- Necessary for legally entering and living in the Russian Federation.

## Initial Migration Registration

- Obligatory for all foreigners in Russia.
- Necessary for legal residency in the Russian Federation.

You must get registered every time you enter the Russian Federation or change your actual place of residence.

We recommend submitting your documents for migration registration on the following working day after your arrival or the date when you actually change residence.

Procedures for getting registered at your place of residence:

- Living in a dormitory or an alternative living arrangement for HSE students – contact the dorm's passport official;
- Living in a rented apartment – contact your landlord (refer to the section "Life in the Big City");
- Staying in a hotel or hostel – contact the hotel administrator.

**The service is free of charge!**

## **Migration Registration after Changing Place of Residence in Russia**

- All hotels and hostels in the Russian Federation are legally mandated to officially register foreign guests, even if they are staying for just one night. As such, if you stay in a hotel or hostel, your registration at a dormitory or privately rented apartment will be automatically cancelled. Upon returning, you will need to get registered again.
- If you require hospitalization, certain medical institutions will register you there as your temporary place of residence. Prior to signing out of the hospital, confirm with its staff whether you have been registered there – you should be provided with a new registration slip. After being discharged, you will need to get registered again at your subsequent place of residence.



# **Extending your registration**

## **For Visa-holders**

- Your visa may be extended for a maximum of one calendar year; further, it is necessary to extend a student visa each year until the end of your studies.
- Submit documents to extend your student visa no earlier than three months but no later than 45 calendar days prior to the date when the initial visa expires.
- For consultations on visa extensions, please contact the HSE Visa and Registration Office ([ivisa.hse.ru/en](http://ivisa.hse.ru/en)).
- After receiving your new visa, you have only three working days to submit documents for migration registration.

## **For persons residing in Russia visa free**

- Migration registration may be extended for a maximum of one calendar year one time during the course of your studies and shall expire along with the validity of your passport.
- Submission of documents to extend registration for students from visa-free countries should take place no earlier than three months, and no later than 25 working days before the expiry of their initial migration registration.
- If you are from a visa-free country, to extend your registration you will need to receive a petition from HSE University (you can order this document here [ivisa.hse.ru/en](http://ivisa.hse.ru/en)); applications will be processed over a period of three days, after which you will receive a notification that it is ready by e-mail.

# Medical examinations, fingerprinting and official photographing

Owing to amendments to Federal Law "On the Legal Status of Foreign Persons in the Russian Federation" international students arriving in Russia for a period of more than 90 days must undergo a medical examination, fingerprinting and official photographing.



## Who are exempt from the new procedures:

- Citizens of the Republic of Belarus;
- Family members of staff of international organizations, as well as employees of diplomatic and consular institutions in Russia;
- Persons with dual citizenship, one of which is Russian citizenship;
- Foreign citizens who hold temporary or permanent residency permits (RVP or VNZh) - we request that you inform the University by sending scanned copies of these documents to [isdocuments@hse.ru](mailto:isdocuments@hse.ru).

These procedures are **obligatory** for all international students (with the exception of the abovementioned categories) staying in the Russian Federation for more than 90 days.

Undergoing these procedures and receiving the respective documentations may take up to three weeks. As such, we recommend starting the process as soon as possible (i.e., immediately upon arriving in the Russian Federation).

Persons who do not undergo such procedures or fail to engage in them within 90 days of their arrival may be subject to the following sanctions: an administrative fine and/or reduction in the time of their stay in Russia.


## **Voluntary medical insurance for international students**

Voluntary medical insurance is a type of personal insurance policy, allowing its holder to visit a medical institution in Russia and receive qualified medical assistance:

- A voluntary medical insurance policy is one of the obligatory documents for international students, as it confirms their right to reside in the Russian Federation; every international student arriving in Russia must acquire a policy for the entire period of their stay.
- International students may acquire a policy from one of the insurance firms recommended by HSE University.
- Medical policies should be acquired prior to arriving in the Russian Federation.

**Important!** Disciplinary measures, as per the University's internal bylaws, may be applied in regards to international students who fail to acquire a medical insurance policy.

## **Student documents**

## **Student ID**

- Required for all students.
  - Issued by your programme's study office  
(shall be issued within three to seven working days).
  - Confirms student status for receiving remaining documents and student benefits.
  - If you have lost your student ID, you can request a replacement from the study office or the Student Service Centre.



E-pass

- Allows you access to all HSE buildings.
  - Only issued upon presenting your student ID or a notification from your study office.

- Gives you the opportunity to use services and resources of HSE University's libraries.

## **Scholarship bank card**

(this doesn't apply to exchange students)

- Necessary for students to receive scholarships and other support funds.
- All payments to HSE University are made with bank cards issued by the MIR national payment system.

## **Moscow social card**

- Available for all full-time undergraduate and doctoral students.
- Discounts on public transport in the City of Moscow and suburban train services.
- May be used as a bank card for cashless purchases of goods and services;
- Provides discounts for certain stores and pharmacies in Moscow.



A Moscow social card can be issued at any of the city's My Documents Multifunctional Centres. It usually takes 30 calendar days to issue these cards.

## Online resources

### HSE e-mail

- Your login and \*initial password for accessing your HSE e-mail will be sent to your personal e-mail address prior to the start of your courses.
- Each student's HSE e-mail is provided by the University for their entire period of study.
- Use your HSE e-mail for confirming exchange of documents and official information between yourself and HSE staff.
- Serves as a means of communication with teachers, study offices and the University's administration.

*\* The initial password is created by the University once a user registers their personal information and is presented as a sequence of symbols. Students must change their password after their initial entry to the system.*

To reset your password. You will need to confirm activation through your telephone and add your personal e-mail to your personal account. This will allow you to change your password.


## **Academic mobility** (this doesn't apply to exchange students)

# Life in the big city

## HSE dormitories

HSE University's dormitory system is a network of buildings, providing comfortable residence for students. This system includes 12 dorms located in the City of Moscow and its surrounding region.

General administration of dormitories, as well as the distribution and check-in of students, is the responsibility of the HSE Office for Dormitory, Guesthouse, and Recreation Centre Management.

## Accommodation rules

- Respect other residents and dormitory personnel;
- Maintain cleanliness;
- Dispose of garbage and waste in specially designated containers;
- Not eat food in bedrooms;
- Smoking, consumption of alcoholic beverages and use of narcotic substances are strictly forbidden in dormitories;
- Observe silence between 11pm and 8am.

## Paying for accommodation

There are two ways of paying for accommodation:

1. Payments via bank:
  - Pick up a receipt with payment information from your dormitory's administration;
  - Fill in the receipt and make the payment at Sberbank;
  - Submit the payment check to the dormitory administration.

## **Independent accomodation searches**

- Use HSE University's «Homeet» app to find a rented apartment ([info.homeet.styleru.org](mailto:info.homeet.styleru.org)).
- If you have decided to find accommodation online, make sure you use reliable websites, e.g., «Cian» ([cian.ru](http://cian.ru)) or «Yandex.Realty» ([realty.yandex.ru](http://realty.yandex.ru)).
- If you plan to rent an apartment independently, it's important to keep in mind the rules to avoid any possible problems when moving in and living there; prior to signing an agreement, inform your landlord that you need to get officially registered at the location.
- HSE University does not register students residing in rented apartments! You must do this with the owner of the apartment. If a landlord tries to tell you otherwise, don't believe them!
- Beware of fraudsters! Never make a payment and/or a despite prior to your arrival in Russia and signing an agreement!





# **Everyday safety**

## **1. Safety at HSE university**

### **Pass system and campus security**

- Access to campus building require e-passes (refer to the «Student Documents» section);
- If you feel you are unsafe while on campus, immediately go to the nearest security post;
- All HSE campuses are monitored 24/7 by its professional security services.

### **Medical assistance**

- If you need immediate medical assistance, phone Russia's emergency number **112** (calls are free of charge);
- Contact your insurance company about medical issues or paid urban clinics in Moscow;
- You must have a valid insurance policy to receive qualified medical assistance;
- Acquire medical insurance from an insurance company recommended by HSE University (refer to «Voluntary Medical Insurance» section).

First aid posts are located throughout every campus, where you can receive immediate medical assistance. All HSE buildings are also equipped with sanitary stations with first aid kits.

## **2. Safety in the big city**

- If you experience an emergency, you can call Russia's emergency number **112** (free of charge):
  - Works everywhere in Russia;
  - Accessible from cellular phone even without SIM cards;
  - English speaking dispatchers are available.
- You can also contact the Centre for International Student Support about any unsafe situations **+7 (985) 040 13 55**.

### **General recommendations and advice**

- Always keep the original versions of documents confirming your legal stay in Russia on your person, e.g., passport, migration card, registration, fingerprint certification, medical insurance policy;
- Keep copies of all of your official documents;
- Regard procedures to check your documents and belongings on the part of the police with understanding; always be polite;
- While traversing the street, make sure you use designated walkways and illuminated areas;
- Only use officially recognized tax services (refer to the section «Life in the Big City»);

- Keep important contacts in your phone, e.g., Centre for International Student Support (**+7 985 040-13-55**), your embassy/consulate, insurance company, etc.;
- Confirm with your insurance company, where you can receive medical treatment;
- Only consume food and beverages that you are sure about; regard unknown products with caution;
- Do not drink water from the tap; boil or filter your water, or use a bottled water delivery service;
- Always bear in mind climate conditions; dress appropriately.

# **Life in Moscow**

## **Cellular communication**

Cellular and online services can cost between 500 and 1,000 RUB a month.

### **Leading cellular operators in Moscow:**

Do not use SIM card sold in underground passages or near Metro entrances.

Only purchase SIM cards from official cellular outlets.

## **Currency exchange**

We recommend taking cash funds for your time in Russia.

In Moscow airports, as well as in the city itself, you can find currency exchange offices, where you can change foreign currency for Russian roubles (usually USD or EUR).

## **Public transport**

### **Metro**

- Hours of operation: every day, from 5.30pm till 1am;
- Payment: with any transport ticker (Ediny or Troika card), or your bank card; students can receive transport discounts with their Moscow social card (refer to the «Student Documents» section);
- Mobile app «Moscow Metro» - [mosmetro.ru/app](http://mosmetro.ru/app).

Follow the safety rules of the Moscow Metro:

- Watch out for your belongings and pockets, especially during rush hour;
- While on escalators, keep to the right side facing forward; you can ascend or descend on the left side, holding onto the railing;
- At metro stations: do not stand at the edge of the platform; after your train stops, stand clear of the doors so that passengers can enter and exit;
- While riding in metro cars, don't lie against doors or try to open them while in transit; try not to block the movement of other passengers boarding or leaving the metro car; do not place your bags on seats; hold onto the handles when the train is moving;
- Use the emergency intercom to report emergencies to the metro operator.

### **MCC and MCD (Moscow urban rail transit)**

Moscow Metro, the Moscow Central Circle (or MCC) and the Moscow Central Diameters (or MCD) form a single metropolitan transport system. There are no extra charges when changing from the metro to the MCC or MCD and back within 90 minutes of the first pass.

### **Street Transport**

- Moscow's urban transportation system uses buses, electric buses and trams;
- Hours of operation: every day, 5am till the late evening; certain lines work late at night;
- Transport payment: with any urban ticket (Ediny or Troika card), or with your bank card; students can get ticket discounts by using their Moscow social card (refer to the «Student Documents» section);
- Press your metro pass or bank card against the yellow validator to board;
- Select a route by using - [yandex.ru/maps](https://yandex.ru/maps).

### **Taxis**

We highly recommend only using official taxi services.

This guarantees safety and quality services. Private or unofficial car services may be unsafe.

The following services have agreements with the City of Moscow. Therefore, you will be guaranteed licensed taxis.

We recommend:

- Yandex GO;
- Uber;
- Citimobil;
- Vezet.

We also recommend using official taxi apps to order rides effectively and quickly.

### **Aeroexpress**

This high-speed train service runs between central metro stations and Moscow's airports.

Aeroexpress routes:

- Kievskiy Railway Station - Vnukovo Airport;
- Paveletskiy Railway Station – Domodedovo Airport;
- Belorusskiy Railway Station –Sheremetyevo Airport.
