Applicants are required to send the application forms and supporting documents by airmail in accordance with the guidelines on the website.

GPA Requirement	Applicants must have completed two semesters at an AIU partner institution <b>before applying</b> and have a cumulative GPA (Grade Point Average) of <b>2.50 (4.0 scale) or higher</b> .	
Level of English Proficiency Requirement	Applicants whose first language is NOT English are required to achieve a standard of TOEFL ® Test score 71 (iBT) or its equivalent, or IELTS score of 6.0 or equivalent. Student Visa Application Procedure	<ol> <li>Submit the following required supporting documents along with the application documents for AIU admission:         <ul> <li>Copy of Passport</li> <li>Evidence of Financial Support (See detailed instructions at the webpage below)</li> </ul> </li> <li>After admission to AIU, each student must submit "Offer Acceptance and Immigration Information Form" online.</li> <li>The Center for International Affairs will submit the application for the CoE to the immigration office in order that admitted students can arrive on AIU campus by our official arrival day.
