INDIVIDUAL STUDY PLAN

Dual Degree students spend the first year at their home institution and the second year at ESCP Europe.

Depending on their previous studies and the courses validated at their home institutions, Dual Degree students might need to enroll in pre-requisite and M1 core courses during their year at ESCP Europe.

Degree Requirements

In order to graduate from the Master in Management, students need to complete:

Master 1 year (at their home university)

Master 2 year (2 semesters at ESCP Europe)

Students must validate:

- 45 ECTS of management courses (core courses + electives):
- Core courses, if needed, out of 10 MIM management compulsory courses (1 core course = 5 ECTS)
- Electives courses (15-hour course = 2 ECTS, 30-hour course = 4 ECTS)
- 2 seminars = 2 ECTS
- 2 French language courses = 2 ECTS
- 1 Master's thesis (16 ECTS) at ESCP Europe or at their home university
- Professional experience (4 ECTS): 40 weeks minimum. Work experience outside their home country is recommended.



Academic Information (i)

Attendance

Class attendance is strictly mandatory. Students will be expelled from a class:

- From the 3rd missed lecture of a 30hcourse
- From the 2nd missed lecture of a 15hcourse

No course can be dropped after it has already started.

Exams

Students are evaluated at the end of the semester. For electives, final exams are held during the last session. The final assessment might include: essays, in-class presentations, written quizzes and examinations and group projects.

Core course assessment is a written exam administered during the last week of the semester (see Academic calendar).

Results

Students can see their results online (after completing a short evaluation survey for each course), usually in February (S1) and June (S2).

Official transcripts will be sent directly to the home institutions.

Academic Information (ii)

Grading system

Students' academic performance is evaluated according to a grade point scale out of 20, as in the graph displayed on the right-hand side of the page.

ESCP Europe GPA (out of 20)

Each semester, the student GPA is updated based on the following calculation:

Average of the final grades (for validated courses only), weighted by the ECTS value of each course.

ESCP Europe Percentile


Each semester, students are ranked for each course on each campus based on the following percentile calculation:

Marks	Definition
18 - 20	OUTSTANDING
15.6 - 17.9	VERY GOOD
13 - 15.5	GOOD
11 - 12.9	FAIR
10 - 10.9	SATISFACTORY
8 – 9.9	POOR
< 8	VERY POOR

[(number of students registered in the course – ranking based on the final grade) * 100/number of students registered in the course]

The best student will get 99% and the last one will get 0%.





Practical Information

Visa & Residence Permit

If you are a citizen from the EU you do not need a visa. For non-EU citizens:

You need a "VISA VLS-TS" long séjour pour études (extended stay study visa with residence permit). Valid for more than 90 days to 1 year.

It is your responsibility to check with the nearest French Embassy/Consulate for the latest visa information. Dual Degree students should not enter France with a tourist visa.

Once you have obtained your relevant visa, you must apply for your French Residence Permit (Carte de Séjour), within 2 months following your arrival in Paris.

Health Insurance

Students will be asked to show proof of insurance, covering them for civil liability risks, repatriation assistance, individual accidents and medical costs abroad. It is **mandatory** for all students.

Housing

ESCP Europe has no accommodation on campus. Students can apply for accommodation on ESCP Europe housing platform:

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the exact date of the start of courses? The exact dates will be communicated to each student by our Programme Office; dates vary depending on the individual study plan and the requirement/exemption for pre-requisite courses.

Is there a mandatory or optional French course available before the beginning of the programme? There is an optional introductory French seminar at the beginning of the programme and mandatory French courses throughout the academic year.

Do you know the dates for course registration? In May, you will receive a notification and instructions for course registration. Please check your ESCP Europe email.

Who should students contact to confirm the courses they have to take? Our Programme Office will contact you to discuss the study plan and clarify which courses you need to take.
